PO 1: RECRUIT SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF STUDENTS

Define Outcome:

The Program of Political Science will recruit a sufficient number of students to sustain a strong educational program and promote lifelong learning in support of the strategic plan.

Assessment Methods:

The Program will monitor enrollment and graduation rates.

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

1. The enrollment threshold for Political Science is 70 students; if our number of majors falls below that threshold, we will monitor our recruitment initiatives.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

While Political Science met the enrollment threshold, the Program will continue to seek improvement by participating in University recruitment initiatives, VIP days, and SOAR sessions.

PO 2: OFFER SUFFICIENT CURRICULAR & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Define Outcome:

Students will judge that a sufficient number of curricular and co-curricular activities were offered by the program.

Assessment Methods:

1. Departmentally-designed Qualtrics student satisfaction survey. A departmentally-designed Qualtrics student satisfaction survey is now annually circulated among Political Science Majors. Students are surveyed regarding the sufficiency of their curricular options.
2. Student Assessment of Curricular Effectiveness: Completed by student majors.
3. Co-Curricular Options

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

1. The threshold of acceptability for the Qualtrics student satisfaction survey is that the majority of students are on the positive side of the Likert responses (Somewhat agree, Agree, or Strongly Agree)
2. The threshold of acceptability for the student-evaluated curriculum map is that the students determine a majority of the courses prepare them for written and oral communication as well as prepare them for proficiency in their concentration. Absent this, a re-evaluation of the curriculum would be undertaken.
3. The threshold of acceptability is to offer co-curricular options in political science as indicated above.

Results and Analysis:

Departmentally-designed Qualtrics student satisfaction survey.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

While the majority of responding students are satisfied with the curricular offerings, Political Science will continue to seek improvement by administering the student survey annually to gauge student satisfaction.

SLO 1: ACQUIRE CRITICAL THINKING SKILLS

Define Outcome:

Students will acquire the critical thinking skills to be prepared for employment and graduate/law school.

Assessment Methods:

1. The California Critical Thinking Skills Test (CCTST) is a senior exit exam taken by all graduate seniors at Tennessee Tech University. Political Science majors will average 90% of the TTU average on the California Critical Thinking Skills Test (CCTST).
2. Educational Testing Services (ETS) major field examination is administered each fall and spring semester to all enrolled majors with senior classification. The ETS exam measures Analytical and Critical Thinking.
3. Departmentally-designed Qualtrics student satisfaction survey. A departmentally-designed Qualtrics student satisfaction survey is now annually circulated among Political Science Majors. Students are surveyed regarding the sufficiency of their curricular options.

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

1. Faculty seek to emphasize student critical thinking gains through use of the California Critical Thinking Test as a component of SLO 1. Specifically, students must score 90% of TTU’s mean score on the CCTST.
2. Performance at a level within 10% of a mean of 50 on the ETS Major Field Examination Analytical and Critical Thinking Score is expected. If this mean drops, faculty will re-evaluate.
3. The threshold of acceptability for the Qualtrics Student Survey is that the majority of students self-select on the positive side of the Likert responses (indicated in purple). In the event this does not happen, faculty will assess possible solutions.

Define Outcome:

Students will demonstrate appropriate knowledge of their discipline.

Assessment Methods:

1. Educational Testing Services (ETS) major field examination is administered each fall and spring semester to all enrolled majors with senior classification. The ETS exam outlines content questions related to Comparative Government and Politics, International Relations, and United States Government and Politics.

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

1. Acceptable performance on the ETS Major Field Examination Sub Score content areas is expected. If scores are below the previous mean, faculty will re-evaluate.

Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:

The ETS scores were higher in spring 2023 than in fall 2022, thus they were not below the previous mean. National averages were not provided. To seek improvement, Political Science has decided to incentivize the top performers by offering a prize for the highest ETS score annually.
