An Act to Add More Locations that Display Student Artwork on Campus

- Whereas, there should be significantly more locations for students of the School of Art Craft and Design to proudly display their work, **and**,
- Whereas, there are currently only three locations that display student work, these being: the Bryan Fine Arts Building, The Appalachian Center for Craft, and thesis work shown at the Joan Derryberry Art Gallery, **and**,
- **Whereas,** Very few students actually utilize any of the locations mentioned and therefore have never had the opportunity to see what Tennessee Tech art students can produce,

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT

- Section 1: This bill shall be known as the "Expanded Student Gallery Act of 2020."
- Section 2: One or more location(s) on Tennessee Tech's campus will be repurposed as spaces to display artwork made by students of the School of Art, Craft and Design.
- **Section 3:** Each determined space will have a rotating schedule that requires each instructor to display works produced in their specific classes at specific times.
- **Section 4:** The artworks displayed will be chosen by the professor(s) of their respective classes with intentions of showing as much diversity as possible (both in the artists themselves and quality/skill levels).
